Council for Exceptional Children Advocacy – Legislative Summit 2021

The CEC Special Education Legislative Summit 2021 took place in Washington D.C. and online from July 19-23. This hybrid format uniquely accommodated advocates in Congress for the education of students with disabilities, special educators, and parents. For example, this year our Illinois advocates including Kevin Rubenstein, Julie Egan, Cheryl Wagemann, Melissa Grandt, Judy Boyens, Toni Galan, and Laura Boedeker advocated with staff from Mr. Durbin's office. They focused on mental health services, shortages of special educators and staff, and on financial appropriations for preschool special education, professional development, and gifted education. CEC 100th Anniversary Series




Dr. Michael M. Gerber addressed a virtual audience on Zoom on August 10, 2021 from his office in Santa Barbara California. The ICEC 100th Anniversary Series attracted a national audience. Dr. Gerber's talk on Elizabeth Farrell and her vision for special education, 1899-1922 was so well received that the audience stayed late and still requested that he return to us to present more information on the life and times of Elizabeth Farrell, Foundress of CEC, August 10, 1921.

Dr. Gerber has done extensive research and writing on Elizabeth Farrell's childhood experiences and her unique educational background that prepared her so well to be the voice for students who were so ignored, neglected, and vulnerable. He shared photographs of children wearing coats and hats and without shoes huddled together in the cold outdoors in New York City in the early 1900s. He shared the timeline of Ms. Farrell's own growth and development and clearly convinced us that she was a woman of great courage and bravely put her extensive knowledge and skills to work for the education and welfare of children. She and her colleagues live on today in the work they started in such organizations as the Children's Bureau and the Council for Exceptional Children and more.

Clearly, there is much to learn about the life and times of Ms. Elizabeth Farrell. We share a proud history in the Council for Exceptional Children as well as in the Illinois Council for Exceptional Children. We truly do stand on the shoulders of giants!

Dr. James M. "Jim" Kauffman, University of Virginia, Charlottesville, VA, dedicated his life to teaching, research and service primarily focusing on the education of students with emotional and behavioral disorders. Dr. Kauffman completed his undergraduate studies at Goshen College and began his career as a classroom teacher. He completed his graduate studies at Washburn University and his doctorate degree at the University of Kansas. He taught in a psychiatric clinic associated with the Children's Division, Menninger Clinic at Southard School in Topeka, Kansas. Dr. Jim Kauffman has authored numerous books and articles and has clearly established himself as a leader in the field.

The Illinois Council for Children with Behavioral Disorders Virtual Conference took place on Friday August 6 and 120 people attended. It was a jam-filled day with excellent sessions. We started the day with Dr. Dean Cantu talking about: After the Coronavirus: What Will This School Year Look Like. Dr. Cantu is known for his excellent sessions, and he did not disappoint. His session was followed by one conducted by Dr. Gerardo Moreno on Cultivating Equity in our Disciplinary Referrals. Dr. Moreno gave excellent information about implicit and explicit bias. Dr. Christalyn Brown discussed Evidence Based Tier 2 and Tier 3 Behavioral Interventions. Michelle Laird and Lisa Cipriano gave a lively session filled with practical ideas on: "Taking Care of the Community of Caretakers." After lunch, Jonte Taylor talked about the importance of educators being performing artists and offered some theatrics. Dr. Rick Van Acker gave an impressive presentation on meeting the mental health needs of students.
