## SPOTLIGHT - EIU STUDENTS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

The students at Eastern Illinois University (EIU) are busy. The Active Chapter Report Form on the ICEC website provides an ideal place to begin an exciting year. At EIU they begin with the most important ingredients – highly motivated students who are organized, manage their time, and balance the many demands on their lives.

Phoebe Tillis and Katie McKee and their Faculty Advisors Dr. Jennifer Buchter and Dr. Cori More are so excited about their plans for the year ahead in SCEC!

The student members of the EIU SCEC Chapter have been inviting new members to join them. They extend invitations to their peers during the University fair in August and during their initial classes. They held their first meeting last week and their first volunteer event at *Camp New Hope* on Saturday, September 18.

The students will hold their CEC 100<sup>th</sup> Year Anniversary Celebration BBQ on Thursday, September 30 and they will march in the Homecoming Parade on

Saturday, October 23. They will partner with the high school Special Olympics team. Dr. Buchter assures me that they are just getting started!

The students at EIU accumulate volunteer hours and earn service-learning credit for their involvement in the activities of SCEC.

According to Phoebe Tillis, EIU's SCEC is student-run and is supervised by two academic advisors from the Department of Special Education. The SCEC Board has scheduled activities such as planning for their float in the homecoming parade, painting pumpkins, a BBQ/picnic in the park, with much more to come later!
